

SEEKING A DIRECTOR OF CLINICAL OPERATIONS!



The Chadwick Center for Children and Families at Rady Children's Hospital- San Diego , is one of the largest hospital-based Children's Advocacy Center (CAC) and trauma treatment centers in the nation. We provide family-focused and trauma-informed services to children and adolescents who may have experienced or witnessed maltreatment, abuse or violence. The Director of Clinical Operations (Clinical Director) oversees clinical programs and operations across the Center by supporting and guidance Program Managers and Supervisors, in coordination with the Executive Director and Medical Director.

The Clinical Director provides administrative supervision and oversight of all staff in Trauma Counseling, Forensic & Supportive Services, the Trauma Prevention and Intervention Department, and the Treatment Outcome office. The Clinical Director also works closely with the Medical Director for oversight of the Child Abuse Pediatrics Department. The Clinical Director guides the direction of clinical services, while ensuring productivity and fiscal performance goals are met.

The Clinical Director coordinates the multi-disciplinary child protection teams of the Center, and acts as a liaison with local partners in law enforcement, child welfare, and prosecution, as well as with other RCHSD departments. The Clinical Director is responsible for ensuring contract and grant goals are met. Experience in writing and managing grants is preferred.

The Chadwick Center is looking for a leader with experience managing cross-collaborative teams in a behavioral health setting, with a focus on clinical and operational functions,, and leading the direction of clinical services.

The applicant for this position must prioritize equity, inclusivity and respect and have a commitment to performance and operational excellence.

Minimum Requirements:

- Master's degree required, licensed preferred as LCSW, LMFT, or Psychologist
- 5+ years of experience in a leadership role in a child serving behavioral health agency or CAC
- Strong leadership and interpersonal skills
- Strong clinical experience in the field of children's mental health and/or trauma
- Strong administrative/operational skills



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
